## STATEMENT ON INCIDENTS DURING THE FKF SUPER CUP

Football Kenya Federation (FKF) strongly condemns the acts of violence, disorder and hooliganism witnessed after today's FKF Super Cup match between Gor Mahia FC and Tusker FC at Nyayo National Stadium.

There is no place for violence, destruction of property, intimidation or any conduct that puts the safety of players, journalists, officials, fans, security personnel and the public at risk.

FKF is also concerned by the use of tear gas and other crowd-control measures during the incidents. While security agencies have a responsibility to maintain order, such measures must be exercised with restraint, professionalism and in accordance with the law.

The Federation will work with the relevant authorities and football stakeholders to establish the circumstances surrounding the incidents and pursue those found responsible for acts of violence or misconduct. Any individual found to have breached FKF regulations or the law, whether a fan, club official, steward or security officer, should face appropriate action in accordance with due process.

FKF will review available match footage and reports from match officials and other stakeholders as part of this process.

We call on fans, security agencies and all football stakeholders to uphold discipline and ensure that football matches remain safe and welcoming spaces for everyone.

FKF remains committed to protecting the integrity of the game and ensuring that no one is above accountability.
